The district will utilize the funds to implement prevention and mitigation strategies in order to continuously and safely open and operate schools by addressing air quality concerns throughout the building. Specifically, the district is looking to add ventilation and air system in the auditorium to allow for use in the summer months during the expanded summer learning opportunities. Additionally, the district is looking to improve/replace existing HVAC systems in the Media Center and the Nurse's Station. These system need to be replace or updated to remain consistent with the most recent CDC guidance for in-person learning.

The district is looking to utilize funds to increase the number of instructional aides to support individual student needs, additional Basic Skills teachers to provide tier 2 and tier 3 supports, and expanded Speech and Language services throughout the district. Additionally, the district is looking to create an expanded summer school program, before and after school tutoring, and the development of clubs and activities.

The district will utilize the remaining funds on the associated TPAF/FICA contributions for staff, health benefits for the instructional aides, and supplies associated with parent instructional programs.
